Adler, Margot. *Drawing Down the Moon: Witches, Druids, Goddess-Worshippers and Other Pagans in America Today.* Penguin, revised edition, 1997, 2007 \$16.95.

A well-known journalist's study of the modern Pagan movement. Dated on some topics, but still an essential classic.

Amber K. Covencraft. Llewellyn, 1998, \$17.95.

Invaluable reference for anyone interested in starting or running a magical group. Covers mundane subjects, such as applying for tax-exempt status, and magical ones, like initiation requirements and rituals, in equal detail--a rarity.

Amber K. True Magick. Llewellyn, 1991, \$4.95.

Introduction to the basics of magick, written in a readable, clear style. Excellent choice as a first book, or as an overview for non-Wiccan relatives or friends.

Curott, Phyllis. Book of Shadows: A Modern Woman's Journey into the Wisdom of Witchcraft and the Magic of the Goddess.

Broadway Books, 1998, \$25.00. Insightful and helpful beginner's book.

DeGrandis, Francesa. Be a Goddess!

Phoenix Publishing, 1989, \$6.95. A classic collection of witch lore collected in Italy over a century ago. The first edition was published in the 1890's.

Orion, Loretta. Never Again the Burning Times.

Waveland, 1995, \$ 13.50. A study of modern Pagan belief systems, often used in anthropology or sociology classes.

Simms, Maria Kay. The Witches' Circle.

LLewellyn, 1996, \$19.95. The author, a professional astrologer, tells her personal journey to find Wicca. Details how she began her own circle, which revolves around astrology. Original rituals and instructions on making robes and masks.

Starhawk. *The Spiral Dance: A Rebirth of the Religion of the Great Goddess*. Harper, 1979, 1989, \$17.00. This classic of feminist spirituality has been a bestseller among Witches since 1979.

Starhawk, Anne Hill, Diane Baker. *Circle Round: Raising Children in Goddess Traditions*. Bantam Doubleday, 1998, \$25.95. A comprehensive parenting guide for people of all faiths and beliefs, based on the Goddess tradition's appreciation of the Earth (the Goddess) and the view that life is a never-ending cycle of birth and death.

Starhawk, M. Macha Nightmare and the Reclaiming Collective. *The Pagan Book of Living and Dying*. Harper, San Francisco, 1997, \$17.00. Practical rituals with prayers, chants, blessings, meditations, essays, and insightful personal stories to offer understanding of death and a powerful new approach to the various stages of dying and grieving.

Valiente, Doreen. *Natural Magic*. Phoenix Publishing, 1985, \$11.50, and *An ABC of Witchcraft Past and Present*. Bookpeople, 1988, \$16.95. Both are excellent introductions, composed of short interesting essays on a wide variety of witchy topics.
